The early years of a child's education are crucial for their life chances. That is why children at Meadowdale Academy are given a safe and happy foundation to make the most of their abilities and talents as they grow up.

We offer a broad and balanced Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) curriculum that promotes children's emotional, social, physical and intellectual needs.

We believe that children learn best through playing and exploring, being active, and through creative and critical thinking which takes place both indoors and outside.

We have created an inviting and stimulating learning environment where children's interests and learning are built upon through play-based learning.

Both our indoor and outdoor learning environments are high quality and well

considered. They are informed by how young children play and learn and what they like and need. This underpins the development of qualities which empower children with the sense that they can progress and achieve.

Building self-confidence, independence, selfesteem and eagerness to learn are at the core of our early years offer and we work in partnership with you as parents and carers to build strong relationships that support learning.

Our EYFS approach allows children to take ownership of their play, find answers on their own and become leaders in their own unique learning adventures.

Excellent teaching and learning helps children to lead happy and rewarding lives and is an investment for future communities. At Meadowdale Academy we believe that learning should be a rewarding and enjoyable experience... and it should be fun!

Through our teaching we aim to equip children with the skills, knowledge and understanding they need to be able to make informed choices about the important things in their current lives. At Meadowdale Academy we follow the National Curriculum where our dedicated team have worked incredibly hard planning progressive learning for every year group in every subject. We work alongside other primary schools in the North East Learning Trust to develop and share the best teaching and learning techniques, underpinned by the latest evidence-based research about what makes the biggest impact on children's learning.

Play-based learning is important to us and we believe very strongly in allowing children to direct their own learning. Staff play alongside the children, observing, modelling and stepping into their play to provide challenge and constant learning opportunities.

Extra support & SEND

Making learning inclusive and enjoyable for each individual pupil is a way of life here where we understand that some pupils may need extra support to make the best possible progress in school.

Our staff have the skills, energy and commitment to give every child the best learning experiences and make sure that parents are fully informed and connected to their child's learning.

Our Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Coordinator (SENDCo) supports small targeted groups of pupils who work with our Emotional Literacy Support Assistant. These sessions are designed to build confidence, develop social and emotional skills and raise attainment through a variety of activities targeted at the individuals involved.

Our school environment is fully inclusive having been altered to accommodate pupils with physical disabilities. We also continually strive to make

further improvements wherever possible. Outside agencies and professionals are also used where necessary to enable students to make the best possible progress.

For children who need additional help in the classroom and around school, we have a fantastic team of learning support assistants who go above and beyond to make them feel more comfortable in their learning environment and support them so that they continue to make progress.

In addition to this our Attendance Officers, SENDCo and Play Therapist work with families to improve attendance as well as with individuals and nurture groups to build a positive outlook to school. Through regular monitoring, our able and talented students are identified and provided with extra opportunities to 'shine', whether it is through additional visits, master classes, leadership experience or peer mentoring in the class room.

NACE Award

At Meadowdale Academy there are no limits on learning. We believe that our purpose is to work together to provide high quality education that develops all children to their full potential.

We are a NACE (National Association for More Able Children in Education) member school and are currently working towards achieving the NACE Award to demonstrate our commitment to this.

Whapahound, care and activities

Here at Meadowdale Academy we offer flexible, affordable and fun care before and after school to support working parents manage their childcare arrangements.

Wraparound care is delivered by qualified staff for pupils in reception to Year 6 in a safe and stimulating indoor and outdoor environment, where children can enjoy their out of school time.

Both before and after school, children are offered healthy, nutritious snacks that meet the government's Healthy School Standards - a monthly menu can be requested from the Academy office and is displayed on our Facebook page.

A variety of fun and stimulating activities are available every day with children placed into age appropriate groups.

Children are encouraged to spend plenty of time outside in the fresh air whenever possible. They can also complete their homework or read their book in a calm, relaxing environment.

Our Breakfast Club runs from 7.30am to 8.45am and After School Club is from 3.10pm through to 5.00pm.

Facilities, extra-curricular activities & Tips

Exploring their talents and trying new things is an important part of childhood. With excellent facilities and staff who are enthusiastic about helping children discover their own passions, Meadowdale Academy is the perfect place for children to spread their wings beyond the classroom.

Children here are lucky to have extensive school grounds to enjoy including: football pitches, two forest school sites and two designated playing areas. Inside we have specially equipped areas for computing, technology, art, science, music and PE. We even have our own school radio station capable of broadcasting to every classroom!

There are a variety of clubs on offer both after school and during the school day including, to name a few: Storytelling Club, French,

drama, choir, mini-band, football, netball and wellbeing walks. We also welcome outside guests into school to teach basketball and family fitness.

We love getting out and about to bring the topics children are learning about to life with an exciting range of trips. We have previously visited Jarrow Hall while studying the Anglo Saxons and Holy Island to support our work on the Vikings. Residential visits have seen children venture further afield including to the

Robinwood Activity Centre in Alston, Dukeshouse Wood in Hexham and Ford Castle in Northumberland. These have offered pupils the exciting opportunity to learn new skills in the great outdoors with activities ranging from archery to climbing.

We also use the Commando Joe's programme which teaches children about British values and the core character traits of resilience, enthusiasm, selfawareness, positivity, excellence, communication and teamwork.

If you go down to the woods today you're sure of a big surprise... by discovering our inquisitive youngsters foraging, building and creating their own outdoor adventures in our Forest School!

Learning within nature enriches children's lives and enhances their education. After all, what better way to learn about the world around you than by grabbing hold of it with two (muddy) hands!

We aim for as many children as possible to join Forest School across our two distinctly different sites. Our top site, which is open and sheltered by the tree canopy, offers a variety of different spaces to explore. In contrast, our second site is more of a wild space that children can freely explore.

Our Forest School is child-led, with no predetermined criteria with which to measure them against. This means all children can participate equally, gaining a

sense of achievement and boosting their self-esteem - a truly holistic approach to child development.

Forest School is proven to support the development of many life skills and personal qualities including: resilience, team work, responsibility, communication, self-confidence, concentration, strength and coordination, the ability to understand and evaluate risk, using initiative, building positive relationships, positive physical and mental wellbeing and fostering creativity.

Above all else however, you can tell by the smiles on their faces that Forest School is fun!
